Recipe: Easy apple cake

We are very fortunate in this area of new Zealand as there are orchards everywhere and many different varieties of apples. This recipe works well with many different type of apple and is a nice one that children can help mix as well.



Ingredients

3 eggs,

1 cup sugar

34 cup oil

2 cups flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

1 can of apple pie filling (approx 400g) or 2 cups of cooked apple.

Method

Pre-heat the oven to 325 f / 160 c.

Beat the eggs in a bowl then add the sugar, oil, flour and baking powder. This will make a thick batter.

Pour half the batter into a greased and floured baking dish e.g 13 inch (33cm) x 9 inch (23 cm) x 2 inch (5cm).

Spoon the apple filling evenly over the batter.

Cover the apple layer with the remaining batter.

Bake for 50 - 60 minutes.

Serve sliced either dusted with icing sugar, with a blob of cream, or even with some custard as a dessert.
